Greater Valley YMCA Offers Free Membership to Furloughed Federal Employees

PEN ARGYL - As the federal government shutdown continues, the Greater Valley YMCA is extending support to those community members impacted by this time of uncertainty. The branches of the Greater Valley YMCA offering relief to those affected are located in Allentown, Bethlehem, Easton/Phillipsburg, Nazareth, Suburban North, and Slate Belt.

Any furloughed federal government employee who is not currently being paid due to the shutdown is welcome to use the YMCA's facilities through a free one-month membership. If an individual is already a member of the Greater Valley YMCA, their next monthly YMCA membership fee will be waived.

"This is about helping our community in this difficult time," said David Fagerstrom, President and CEO of the Greater Valley YMCA. "At the Y, we work to strengthen the foundations of our community. When we see an area in our community where help is needed, we respond. We hope that those impacted by the government shutdown will take advantage of the mental, physical and emotional support we aim to give those in need.," Fagerstrom added.

The YMCA's support of our community extends beyond the government shutdown, as the Y has always focused on social responsibility. The Y currently provides financial assistance to those in need to ensure everyone has access to the YMCA's facilities and program offerings, and provided over one million dollars in subsidy/scholarships to the Lehigh Valley in 2018.

Babies Born in 2019 Eligible for \$100 to Kick-Off College Savings

Under the new Keystone Scholars Program, \$100 will be deposited in an education savings account for any PA baby born or adopted in 2019.

It was created by the General Assembly last year to boost college savings and is funded by private donors.

The Long and Winding Road

Some things we learn because we want to and some things we learn because we need to. To be even more accurate, some things we learn we didn't even want to learn. My education has taken a long and winding road to reach where I am today but it was definitely not a dead end. The basement was finished and the duct system was inaccessible. I have to return to take measurements that I will detail in another article but obviously ones that nobody has done yet in this house. Duct pressure, total air leakage, register flow, infrared photos, heat loss and gain to name a few. When I am finished with these, I will have what amounts to an MRI of this house. Using probably \$20000 worth of tools I will reveal every comfort problem in the home. That is an exciting journey for me every single time I do it.

What's even more exciting is that I can prescribe a solution for every problem and turn that beautiful house into a beautiful, comfortable house.
