1st Anniversary of the County's Fake is Real Campaign

County Executive Lamont G. Mc-Clure and the Northampton County Drug and Alcohol Division will hold a press conference to commemorate the County's Fake is Real campaign and highlight the accomplishments of 2023 at the Department of Human Services Building in Conference Room 3 on Wednesday, January 31, at 1:30 p.m.

The Fake is Real awareness campaign aims to educate families, specifically young adults in the 18-35 age group, about the dangers of buying counterfeit prescription pills that may contain fentanyl. The campaign is funded from the proceeds that the County secured from litigation against opioid manufacturers. Funding from the settlement allows the County to strengthen its response to the ongoing epidemic, raise awareness to prevent addiction, and offer services to treat it.

New efforts will be announced during the event that will help combat fentanyl in our community, as well as a way to pay tribute to those we have lost.

County Executive Lamont G. Mc-Clure, Northampton County Director of Human Services Susan Wandalowski, Northampton County Drug & Alcohol Administrator Kathleen Jiorle, and District Attorney Stephen Baratta will provide remarks and take questions from the press.
