Synagro And Waste Management Have Withdrawn Their Plan

By John Hambrose / Communications Manager Waste Management's Greater Mid-Atlantic Area PEN ARGYL - Synagro and Waste Management have withdrawn their plan to develop the Slate Belt Heat Recovery Center project in Plainfield Twp.

Plainfield Twp. Manager Tom Petrucci was informed of the companies' decision in a letter Jan. 31. Project permit applications submitted to the Northeast Regional Office of the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection also are being withdrawn.

The proposed project planned to use waste heat from the Green Knight Energy Center to dry biosolids to create a Class A fertilizer and a material that could be used as a kiln fuel. The center's product offered the opportunity to recycle organic nutrients and offset the use of chemical fertilizers and fossil fuels.

The letter, signed by Pam Racey, Synagro vice president for business development, and Scott A. Perin, Waste Management's regional director of disposal operations, concluded with: "Please extend our appreciation to the Township Board of Supervisors, Planning Commission members, zoning officer, solicitor, engineers, consultants and the local residents who participated in the process. We would like to specifically thank the Green Knights for all of their efforts to make this a successful program in furtherance of their mission to support the local Slate Belt communities."
