Addressing Avian Flu Outbreak with State Game Warden

On Thursday, I had the opportunity to join State Game Warden Dave Furmato for a series of visits to different locations throughout the 138th District, including Lake Minsi and the Appalachian National Scenic Trail near the Delaware Water Gap.

We discussed various duties of a game warden throughout the changing seasons, including the recent outbreak of High Pathogen Avian Influenza (avian flu) happening in the commonwealth. This outbreak is suspected to have caused the deaths of hundreds of Snow Geese in the greater Lehigh Valley.

In response, authorities, including the state game warden, are actively working to remove and safely dispose of affected birds while taking measures to help prevent further spread.

Game wardens have been responding to public reports of sick or injured wildlife, including birds presumed to be infected.

Residents can assist in these efforts by reporting any sick or deceased wild birds, especially Snow Geese and poultry, to the Pennsylvania Game Commission.
