Looking to Stock Fish in Your Private Pond or Stream?

The PA Aquaculture Advisory Council is alerting property owners who normally stock their private ponds or streams that last year's drought caused significant trout inventory shortages across the eastern seaboard.

As a result, Pennsylvanians may end up having to look out of state to get their trout this year. The council is reminding them that in addition to filing a Notice of Stocking, written permission from the PA Fish and Boat Commission must be obtained before those out-of-state fish are stocked in the Commonwealth. Directions on both the Notice of Stocking and getting written permission can be found here.
