I'm honored to have the opportunity to amplify everything the station represents." She joins WDIY as the next step in a prolific Lehigh Valley career. Most recently, she was director of strategic partnerships at People First Federal Credit Union following a role as enterprise marketing manager at Alvin H. Butz, Inc., and The Butz Family of Companies. She has also been vice president of marketing and communications at Lehigh Valley Economic Development Corporation (LVEDC).
