## Young at Art Returns with Demonstrations, Scholarships Free Family-Friendly Event Showcases Creative Learning

The Lehigh Valley Arts & Cultural Alliance has prioritized accessibility for all at the event. Young at Art is held at a venue fully accessible to individuals with mobility access needs. American Sign Language interpreters will be working throughout the event to provide ASL interpretation for announcements and performances. A sensory room with calm, quiet activities is available for attendees who need a break from the action.
