Lithium Battery Awareness

The National Waste & Recycling Association (NWRA) and the Solid Waste Association of North America (SWANA) released a joint policy statement addressing the critical issue of lithiumion battery disposal. Improper disposal of these batteries presents significant safety hazards, including fires that endanger people, property, and the waste and recycling infrastructure.

The statement reads, "Lithium-ion batteries require special handling for proper recycling and disposal. They should never be placed in waste or curbside recycling bins as they can cause fires, endangering people and waste and recy-



cling infrastructure. The best solution is to use take-back programs designed for safe collection and recycling. NWRA and SWANA are committed to promoting awareness and supporting policy initiatives that ensure proper battery disposal to protect workers, communities and the environment."
