  - In total, Plainfield Township received \$2,185,437 from the operation of the landfill in 2023
- From these host fees, Plainfield Township Volunteer Fire Company received \$1.5 million to purchase a new fire truck

Because WM recognizes Pen Argyl and Wind Gap as close neighbors, GCSL entered into agreements with both communities dating back to 2004 and 2005, respectively to provide monetary and in-kind benefits to the Borough residents.

### Here's how the operation of Grand Central Landfill made living in Wind Gap Borough and Pen Argyl Borough more affordable in 2023:

- In 2023, the Neighboring Municipality Agreement provided Wind Gap Borough with \$848,700 (\$1.20 per ton) of which approximately \$530,000 was used for stormwater improvements on Constitution Avenue. The balance of the funds supported other improvement projects within the Borough
- Wind Gap Borough received free trash and recycling collection and disposal worth an estimated value of \$475,000 (1,221 households\*)
- These benefits help save Wind Gap Borough households an average of \$1,084 a year
- In 2023, the Facility Cooperation Agreement provided Pen Argyl Borough with \$915,892 (\$1.30 per ton). These funds were used for community improvements and to match grants that helped fund street improvements
- · Pen Argyl Borough received free trash and recycling collection and disposal worth an estimated value of \$648,000 (1,321 households\*)
- These benefits help save Pen Argyl Borough households an average of \$1,026 a year
