

Celebrating Our History with America250PA

I was honored to join Danielle DiMarco, America250PA's events coordinator, and my colleagues from the Northampton County Legislative Delegation last week at the Northampton County Courthouse for a photo to commemorate the adoption of the America 250PA resolution in our community.

The Pennsylvania Commission for the United States Semiguincentennial (America 250PA), established by the Legislature and governor in 2018, is dedicated to planning and coordinating the commemoration of the 250th anniversary of our nation's founding. This resolution marks Northampton County's role in this important milestone.

Northampton County has a deep connection to America's founding. On July 8, 1776, Easton was one of only three locations, along with Philadelphia and Trenton, where the Declaration of Independence was first publicly read following its adoption by Congress on July 4. At precisely noon, the proclamation took place on the courthouse steps in Centre Square, accompanied by the ringing of Northampton County's Liberty Bell, which remains on display at the courthouse today. A historic flag of stars and stripes, believed to be the oldest existing example of the original Easton flag, is also preserved at the Easton Public Library.
