Don't be that person who asks, "How much longer can I wait?" Get reacquainted with what's happening to your insides. Ask yourself if you can stay grateful in the midst of this trial. Based on the difficulties you've endured thus far, is proof enough you can do this! It's not what we can't do; it's what we can do! If one must, one can!

Incredibly, at my lowest, when my life hung in the balance, my hope was the highest. I made plans, lots of plans! My bucket list became a work of art! That is what one does when you fear you may lose them. But before you begin filling up your schedule with plans, treasure this moment. Remember this moment. Let this moment drive you to continue to care the way you do this very moment. Call someone who inspires you. Better yet, call someone who challenges you. If something tugs at your heart, make it right. Give thanks to your higher power. For me, it's my God and while the world feels like it is spinning out of control I trust someone larger than me has it under control. Be still in the silence our world has become and let the quiet comfort you. Taking every precaution possible is not being in hysteria. If you are made to feel being too careful is extreme, let it be the biggest mistake you ever made.

qualify for loan forgiveness.

The program is open to small businesses, veterans organizations, sole proprietorships, self-employed individuals and independent contractors, so long as each entity has 500 or fewer employees.

The application period for small businesses and sole proprietors will open on April 3. Self-employed individuals and contractors can apply starting on April 10. Applications are available here.

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
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
