

Guidelines Available for Construction Industry Reopening

PEN ARGYL - Following Governor Wolf's announcement that the construction industry can resume normal operations on May 1, the Department of Health extended guidelines to ensure these employers can operate in a way that minimizes the risk of spreading COVID-19.

The guidelines include cleaning frequently touched surfaces, providing sufficient distance between employees, staggering breaks and shifts, providing masks for employees and more. The full list of guidelines is available here.

Deadline Extended to Apply for PHEAA State Grants

PEN ARGYL - In response to disruptions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, the Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance Agency (PHEAA) has extended the deadline for college students to apply for state grants from May 1 to May 15 for the 2020-21 academic year. The new deadline applies both to renewals and first-time applicants. More information on how to apply for state grants and how the coronavirus will impact state grant and special loan programs is available on PHEAA's website https://www. pheaa.org/about/covid-19.shtml. In addition, the agency recently of-

fered a three-month forbearance on all PHEAA-owned private loans for borrowers affected by COVID-19. More details are available here. Borrowers must contact their loan servicer, American Education Services (AES), in order to request this forbearance. The AES COVID-19 webpage includes more information about options for borrowers to postpone payments for both federal and private student loans.

So many useless accessories are hanging on systems I service every week. Humidifiers that were ineffective, air cleaners that are restrictive and cause air conditioner problems, and electronic air cleaners that haven't worked in years. None of these customers seem to want the accessories repaired and sure don't want to pay to have them removed. A humidifier that doesn't work can actually allow mold to grow on the internal parts and cause much more harm than it ever did good.

There is always advertising out there to get people excited about something and even though it isn't my job to counteract that, I can't just play into the hype and take someone's money. I always have a practical discussion with people to share everything I know about a product before I agree to install something. I won't relieve someone of their money just because they have a misconception about a product.

Update on Gracedale Nursing Home

EASTON - Northampton County continues to do everything possible during the Covid-19 pandemic to limit exposure to the residents and staff at Gracedale.

"We appreciate the bravery and dedication of Gracedale employees," says Lamont McClure. "They're working tirelessly to keep some of our most vulnerable residents safe during this outbreak."

As of April 20th, fifty residents have tested positive for the virus. Six are in recovery in an isolation ward, pending a return to their units. Unfortunately, four residents have passed away.

Out of the 700 employees which work at Gracedale, twentythree have tested positive for the Coronavirus. Five have finished their quarantine periods and are back at work.

Gracedale is the largest nursing home under one roof in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. There are more than 600 residents living at Gracedale with approximately 700 people tasked with caring for them.
