
## **Super Bowl Celebration at the White House**

## **Made in America Grant Program**

The U.S. Small Business Administration is offering up to \$1.1 million in grants to support small manufacturers through its new Manufacturing in America Grant Initiative.

The funding will go to three eligible applicants who will provide training and technical assistance to small businesses in the SBA's Empower to Grow (E2G) Program.

E2G offers free courses, hands-on training, and one-on-one consulting to help small manufacturers grow, comply with regulations, and compete for government contracts—particularly in industries like timber, energy, aluminum, and steel.

Eligible applicants must have at least three years of experience delivering training to small manufacturers and the capacity to provide hands-on support.

The deadline to apply is May 12 at 11:59 p.m. EDT at grants.gov.
