137th District National Merit Scholars

Last week, on my behalf, Kirsten Esposito attended the National Merit Scholar Ceremony held at the Stroudmoor Country Inn in Stroudsburg.

Each year, approximately 1.6 million students from roughly 22,000 high schools enter the National Merit Scholarship competition. Commended students are recognized for their high scores on the PSAT, representing the top 3-4% of test-takers. Semifinalists, the next level, represent roughly 1% of test-takers in each state and are eligible to apply for Finalist status. Finalists, the most selective group, are eligible for National Merit Scholarships.

The ceremony honored 19 award recipients including Finalist Veeren Sheka (Picture above with his parents) of Nazareth Area High School, and Stephanie Zheng, who is enrolled in Liberty High School and was recognized as a Commended student. Other award recipients from the 137th District include Cian Bailie (Finalist), Lisa Barry (Commended), Sofia Dubrovskaja (Commended) and Sajawal Mushtag (Commended).

Supporting Our EMS Providers

Next week, May 18-24, is National EMS Week, an opportunity for each of us to recognize and extend special thanks to the men and women who answer the call every day to help save lives. This year's theme is "We Care. For Everyone."
