my friends were encouraging as well. Most importantly though God since he gave me my brain and determination


to get good grades. The most challenging was convincing myself to study when I did not feel like it."

Cheap is for Today, Quality is Forever

There are many brands of furnaces and air conditioners. Within those brands there are there are several levels of quality and that is reflected in the prices of each one. The warranties also vary widely from basic to all inclusive. The incidental materials used on an installation also vary and in ways a homeowner would never see. Installers know the difference and it is up to them to choose what level of quality they want to provide for their customers. The lower end model of a lower end brand of equipment will have a minimal warranty and will have other characteristics that are not particularly desirable. Those are usually things like being noisy, inefficient and prone to short service life. But if low cost was what the homeowner was looking for, they fit the bill.

High end systems are not usually the best value either because they are thousands of dollars higher in price and the efficiency gains don't bear out the extra cost. It may never be recovered in the life of the system. Yes there are some cool features but my assessment shows that this also not a good value. I have chosen an upper middle efficiency level and quality level to offer when I quote a system. I feel like there is a lot of value in the equipment and the warranty is great. In the case of the system we use, the warranty on the biggest component, the compressor, is for the life of the purchaser. If it ever fails, the manufacturer provides us with a new complete outdoor unit. This replaces every single component and takes less time than replacing just the compressor. The rest of the parts have 10 years of warranty. When we install a system we also use the best components we can buy, right down to the brazing rods we connect the copper tubes with. You don't see these things but since our ultimate goal is 20 years of operation with nothing more than annual maintenance, we can't afford to take any chances.

You can get any number of prices when you need to replace your system and that is never a bad idea. But ask the hard questions and listen to the responses. Like how long have you been using this brand and how many breakdowns have you had with them. You will get what you pay for if you are diligent and value is what you really want. Ask for references and call them. Especially ones that have been installed for 5 years.
