\$200,000 Grant Awarded for Future Affordable Townhomes

EASTON - County Executive Lamont G. McClure and the Northampton County Department of Community and Economic Development announced \$200,000 awarded by the Commonwealth Financing Authority (CFA) to construct affordable townhomes at the former site of the Glendon Hotel in Glendon Borough.

The CFA Board approved grants through Local Share Accounts established by the Pennsylvania Race Horse Development and Gaming Act (Act 71 of 2004).

"The Local Share Accounts Program supports projects that promote economic development, community development, and public interest throughout the Commonwealth, and I'm pleased the Glendon Hotel project was selected," says Lamont G. McClure.

The Glendon Hotel Affordable Housing project will result in five 3-bedroom, 2.5-bathroom townhomes. Further funding for this project will be sought through Pennsylvania HOME Investment Partnership Program (HOME) funds and through an investment of Federal HOME entitlement funds.

Fighting for Your Second Amendment Rights


House Democrats are taking aim at your Second Amendment rights.

PEN ARGYL - This week, they planned to advance four bills through the state House that would do little to improve community safety and much to erode your rights guaranteed through both the Pennsylvania and United States constitutions.

Two of the bills were adopted despite my emphatic "NO" vote. House Bill 714 would call for universal background checks for all gun purchases while House Bill 1018 would create a "red flag" process that could lead to confiscation of people's firearms without due process.

We were able to defeat a measure that would mandate gun owners report lost or stolen firearms within 72 hours (House Bill 338). House Democrats then
