New Funding Supports Families, Small Businesses, Nursing Homes, First Responders and More

PEN ARGYL - Last week, the General Assembly approved a bipartisan package of bills to deliver funding to families and organizations impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic, including small businesses, nursing homes, first responders and affected employees. The funding comes from a portion of Pennsylvania's share of money from the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES)

Approximately two-thirds of all COVID-19 deaths in the state have been residents of nursing homes and other long-term living facilities. More than \$690 million in the package is dedicated to increased testing, infection control, personal protective equipment and other measures to support residents and staff

An additional \$225 million is directed to help small business recover from the damages caused by the pandemic and the governor's shutdown orders. A portion of new funding directed to counties can be used for small business assistance as well.

The CARES package also provides important assistance to low- and middle–income families by investing \$175 million through the Pennsylvania Housing Finance Agency to provide rent and mortgage assistance. The program would provide monthly mortgage assistance, up to \$1,000, and rent assistance, up to \$750, to those who lost their job or experienced a 30 percent or more loss in pay as a result of the coronavirus.

In addition, a new \$50 million COVID-19 Crisis Fire Company and Emergency Medical Services Grant Program would be created to provide grants to all companies that received funding through the Fire Company Grant Program and Emergency Medical Services Grant Program in January. Companies that received a grant will automatically receive the additional money, while companies that did not receive a grant will need to submit an application to the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency.

Senate leaders offered more information on these and other programs funded by the CARES Act at a news conference last week.

There are many brands of central air conditioners on the market and many levels of quality within each brand. There is always one level of quality I suggest avoiding and that is the entry level model. Every manufacturer has to compete with every other and most times the price they show to attract a customer's attention is for the base model. In an air conditioner the base model is actually not a good value because it is missing a couple protective devices that can help protect the system if something goes wrong. They are designed to be as minimal as possible in every aspect. They have less screws holding them together, less quality on every part inside. That is why the warranty on these systems is short too. Most parts will have a one year warranty and the compressor will have a 5 year warranty. The quality of this particular model in any brand does not reflect on the manufacturer though because they are providing what some customers want. Where I see the biggest problem is when builders use this model and then a homeowner has to take over after the house is built and attempt to get

more than 8 years or so out of these models.

I'm not suggesting that the homeowners would have opted for a more expensive model but they should have had it offered to them in case they knew the information I am sharing today. The second level models are really the first that should be considered and only if the budget means everything at the moment and long life is not important. The real value point is probably the third step up from the bottom. The warranty will be much better, the quality will be noticeably better, and the system will probably purr for 20 years without and major cost to the owner if it is installed correctly. If you break it down by cost of ownership you may find that the budget system could cost much more than the value system even though the installed cost was 1/3 less. A \$7000 system that lasts 18 years has an annual cost of \$466/year. A \$5000 system that lasts 9 years has an annual cost of \$555/year. In addition to the better quality, the efficiency is always better because of more copper and aluminum for heat transfer. If it is a heat pump, the difference could be \$10/month sav-

ings in operating cost at least. Don't just look at the bottom line and don't choose by brand without checking on the model you are getting.
