

House **Push Democrats** Through Irresponsible State **Budget, Energy Tax**

PEN ARGYL - Adopting a state budget each year is one of the most important tasks of the General Assembly. I take seriously my commitment to ensure your tax dollars are invested responsibly to support the core functions of government.

That's why I was very disappointed this week as majority House Democrats piled on an additional \$2 BILLION increase to Gov. Josh Shapiro's already bloated budget proposal and forced through a nearly \$46.5 billion spending plan. That's a \$5.7 billion, or 14%, increase over the current year. This level of spending is unsustainable and, if enacted, would lead to a 30% tax hike in the near future.

We cannot and should not spend money we don't have. Our citizens should not bear the burden of higher taxes to pay for a bigger government.

Equally damaging is the inclusion of a \$663 million energy tax on Pennsylvania employers and consumers. According to the nonpartisan Independent Fiscal Office (IFO), this tax would increase electricity rates by nearly four times. Everyday, I get calls and emails from people and families who are struggling financially, as do my colleagues who serve all across the state. I will not support a tone deaf budget that will further send constituents in dire straights.

House Bill 611 now goes to the Senate, where I am hopeful it will be amended to reflect the needs and wishes of our hard-working taxpayers in the Commonwealth.
