## Lehigh University Team Working on Project to Disrupt Spread of Coronavirus



BETHLEHEM - Lehigh University Professors Himanshu Jain and Frank Zhang (respectively), members of the team working on a new technology to disrupt the spread of the coronavirus.

A team of Lehigh University professors is working on a project to develop new technology they hope will disrupt the spread of the coronavirus, and continue to have broader public health uses even after the COVID-19 crisis has passed.

The six-person team received a \$25,000 grant from the state of Pennsylvania this week for the project, which may result in a spray or antiviral product that can be coated on commonly-encountered surfaces and actively incapacitate the virus from further transmission.

## Beaches Restrooms Open at Delaware Water Gap National Recreation Area

BUSHKILL, PA - Delaware Water Gap National Recreation Area is following COVID-19 guidance from the White House, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), state and local public health authorities, and the National Park Service (NPS) Office of Public Health and is using a phased approach to increase recreational access and services throughout the park. Employees continue to examine each facility, function, and service that the park provides to ensure that park operations comply with current public health guidance and that public areas and workspaces are safe and clean for visitors, employees, partners, and volunteers.

Increased recreational access and changes to park operations during this phase include:

Turtle Beach in NJ will be open daily during daylight hours beginning June 18. Milford and Smithfield Beaches in PA are also open including the boat and canoe launches. There will be no lifeguards on duty at park beaches this summer.


