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#### Raising Awareness of Sudden Death in Epilepsy

On Wednesday, I attended a House Health Committee meeting to speak in support of House Bill 1442, also known as Morgan Rose's Law. As a co-prime sponsor of the bill with Rep. Lisa Borowski, I felt a deep responsibility to share my family's story in hopes of preventing other families from going through what we did.

My daughter Lauren was born with a severe brain injury and faced enormous challenges in her short life, including epilepsy. At just 4 years old, she passed away suddenly and without warning. Our world shattered. We were left heartbroken and searching for answers. It was only after her autopsy that I first heard the words Sudden Unexpected Death in Epilepsy, or SUDEP. That was the official cause of her death, something I had never even known existed.

House Bill 1442 aims to improve how SUDEP is identified and recorded. The bill would require coroners to investigate whether a death in someone with epilepsy was related to a seizure and to document SUDEP on the death certificate when appropriate. Very little is known about SUDEP, which is why this work is so important. With better data, we can support more research, raise awareness, and pursue critical funding to help families and save lives.

During the meeting, I asked my colleagues to support the bill. I am grateful to share that it unanimously passed the committee and now moves to the full House for consideration. I will keep working to make sure Lauren's story, and others like hers, lead to change.
