## **Bangor Area School District Educational Foundation Awards** Record-Breaking \$60,000 in Scholarships

BANGOR - This year marks a historic milestone for the Bangor Area School District Educational Foundation. At the high schools annual senior award ceremony, the Foundation awarded nearly \$60,000 in scholarships—the largest total since its inception in 1997. In recent years, the Foundation has awarded approximately \$45,000 annually, but thanks to the continued generosity of community members, alumni, and new donors, this year's total reflects a powerful investment in the future of Bangor's graduating seniors.

Among the new scholarships added this year is the Blau/Kristof/Cruver Scholarship in Environmental Science, created by four Bangor High School alumni who have joined together to give back to the community that helped shape their lives. This \$10,000 renewable award supports students pursuing careers in environmental science and reflects the founders' shared passion for environmental stewardship and educational opportunity.

The Foundation, a non-profit organization operating independently from the school district, now manages a growing portfolio of scholarships made possible by donors committed to supporting the next generation of leaders, artists, scientists, and changemakers.
