Insulation Frustration

My training is in all aspects of energy usage and conservation so I tend to look at the big picture whenever I'm discussing a project. It is safe to say that nobody ever uses too much insulation. It is much more common for builders to use less than they should. It is also far too common for it to be installed incorrectly. Neither of these shortcuts violates the building code but they both doom the structure to excessive energy usage. When I run a load calculation on a building I always assume those shortcuts unless I have some reason to believe that every detail of the insulation will be done correctly. There is a grading system for insulation and I learned it at HERS (home energy rating system) training. It is not a requirement of the building code but it makes a huge difference when insulation is installed properly. Energy moves in 3 ways; conduction, convection, and radiation. Fiberglass is the most prevalent type of insulation used and it needs air to do its job. That air MUST be dead still or the insulation is nearly worthless. A convective current in a wall where fiberglass is installed wrong destroys the insulation value. Wires inside walls make it very difficult to install fiberglass correctly and that's probably the biggest reason why it never happens. In ceilings it is much the same. The top side of the insulation is exposed and moving air erodes the dead space for an inch or two. That reduces the actual insulation value by 10%. Before you know it you have lost 20 to 30% of the energy you should be saving. It is impossible to achieve a tight well insulated home with a low bidder process for selecting contractors. Everyone needs to cut as much time off a job as possible and still have it pass the inspection. The inspection does not begin to address the shortcomings of a bad insulation job so it's a race to the bottom.

Conduction is much harder to stop as an energy reduction practice. The new green board sheathing is probably the best option there. Thermal bridging is a necessary evil in building a strong home.

Radiation can only be slowed by using good windows. A home with no windows would be much more energy efficient but nobody wants

to save energy that badly.

Oversized furnaces and air conditioners affect the indoor comfort and humidity year round but most contractors won't risk using the right size equipment even if they know what that is because of the lack of effective insulation.
