There are some new solutions to old problems in the air conditioning business. Something our area experiences in summer is high humidity. Since evaporation is the human body's way of lowering surface temperature we all know that high humidity prevents perspiration and leaves us drenched. That is why when you walk into an air conditioned space it feels even cooler than it really is. If the indoor humidity is controlled you get the lower temperature as well as the evaporative cooling. It is the best feeling of the day for someone who works outside. Unfortunately

if an air conditioning system was not sized correctly the indoor humidity may be almost as high as the outdoor humidity. The temperature will be lower but it won't evaporate the perspiration from your skin. That causes the 'clammy' feeling. There are not many fixes for that and nobody ever is willing to replace a working system because of that problem. The work around is to set the temperature even lower than you really want it just to remove more humidity. That will show up in the electric bill and still isn't really comfortable. When you get into the nuts and bolts of air conditioning science there are more than a few key factors that affect comfort and just as many ways to alter a system to improve

it. Oddly enough, slowing down the air will reduce humidity. Most people think that more air means better cooling but in this case, less is more. The reasoning for this is that the cooling coil inside the fan unit should be at around 40° and if air traveling over it is moving slowly enough, it will reach the dewpoint and humidity will turn into condensation and run off the coil and into the drain. There are a host of problems that can interfere with this process though.

The outdoor unit plays a big part as well. New indoor and outdoor units have the ability to vary their speed to match the amount of cooling the space needs. That drastically improves indoor humidity. Just the difference in the amount of cooling required between noon and midnight is huge. If the system can match what's needed, energy cost is reduced and comfort is improved. This solves the problem of contractors oversizing equipment. If a variable speed system is too large, money was wasted and the system will probably never run at full capacity but it won't feel like a meat locker in the living room.

If high indoor humidity is a problem in your home there other factors that affect it besides the HVAC system and they should be addressed first. But know there are solutions for this prob-
