When? Friday, November 1st 2024, From 8:45–11:15*

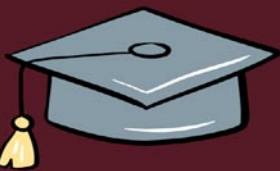
*Please come 30 minutes early to set up

Spirited History Walking Tour Of Downtown Stroudsburg Featuring Three Main Street Establishments

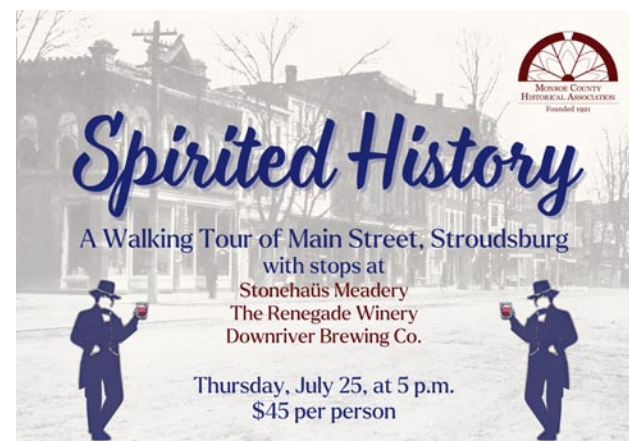
