People gather from far & wide for the celebration of community, family, friends, food, fun, Crowning of the Queen and of course - fireworks! This Year's Celebration Queen was Alexandra Martocci who was crowned Big Time Queen 2024 by last year's queen, Sophia Albanese.

The Annual "Big Time" celebration as it's known, dates back to 1883. The term was given by Fr. Denisco who started the civic-religious celebration because he felt the need for camaraderie. The initial celebration was patterned after the festival that took place in Roseto, Italy. Festival days were set aside to honor Mary, the Mother of Jesus and was always held on the last weekend in July. On Saturday night, a fireworks display takes place and then on Sunday the procession down Garibaldi Avenue to Honor Mary.

As the years went on, the celebration program grew. It included a variety of Amusements, circus-type shows, band concerts and finally the Fireworks display on Saturday night. A vast assortment of food items complimented the entertainment including italian delicacies such as Sausage and Peppers, Pizza Fritta, italian candy and cookies. Lehigh Valley Itialian American Band who were sponsored by Isidore and Yvonne DeThomas ended the ceremony with music as the Queen and her court descends steps to the float and the girls descend to their convertibles for a parade thru the streets of Roseto.
