

State Budget Update: Mental Health

In the 2024-25 state budget, Pennsylvania has put a strong focus on improving mental health care. We increased funding for mental health services by \$67.5 million, which is a 7.6% increase. This includes \$20 million specifically for county mental health funds to support resources like inpatient care, therapy, crisis help, and support for students' mental health in schools.

The budget also aims to keep and improve existing mental health services across the

Pennsylvania continues to make Mental Health Funding one of its top priorities.

This Wednesday, Aug. 14, is the firstever National ABLE Savings Day! Our state's PA ABLE program, like other ABLE programs across the country, gives individuals with disabilities a way to save money for the future without impacting important benefits like Medical Assistance (Medicaid) or Supplemental Security Income (SSI).

There are also great tax benefits for saving with PA ABLE, including:

- Contributions are deductible from PA state income taxes.
- Earnings and contributions grow tax-free.
- No taxes are owed for qualified withdrawals.
- Accounts aren't subject to the state inheritance tax.

Pennsylvanians with a qualifying disability can start saving with PAABLE today. There are seven savings and investment options to choose from. PA ABLE account owners, family and friends can contribute up to \$18,000 annually to a PA ABLE account. The savings can be used to pay for a wide variety of disability-related expenses including rent, groceries, health care, vehicle adaptations, assistive technology and more.

To celebrate ABLE Savings Day, PA Treasurer Stacy Garrity, PA ABLE experts at the Pennsylvania Treasury Department, and ABLE experts from around the country are hosting free webinars to help everyone understand what ABLE programs are and how they can start saving.
