COVID-19 Drive-through vaccination and testing center

culture of the area.

Lamont McClure and Lehigh Valley Hospital-Coordinated Health Allentown Hospital (LVH-CHA) remind Northampton County residents that the drivethrough center at 3100 Emrick Blvd. in Bethlehem Township offers both testing for COVID-19 and vaccinations. Hours of operation are Monday/Wednesday/Friday from 10:00AM - 2:00PM and Tuesday/Thursday from 2:00PM - 6:00PM. Vaccinations are by appointment only and are only available for Northampton County residents ages twelve and over. Patients can choose from all three available vaccines: Pfizer, Moderna and Johnson & Johnson. Pfizer and Moderna require two shots administered three weeks apart, Johnson and Johnson requires only one dose.

"Recent infection data shows the pandemic isn't over yet," says Lamont McClure. "I encourage everyone to get vaccinated and, if you begin showing symptoms, to get tested for COVID-19.

Vaccines and testing offer us the best chance of decreasing the risks from this virus."

To make an appointment for a vaccine at the COVID-19 testing site use one of the following options:

Call 833-584-6283 (833-LVHN-CVD). The COVID-19 Vaccine Hotline is open Monday-Friday 8:30 a.m.-5:30 p.m. and Saturday-Sunday 9 a.m.-5 p.m.

A Physician's order is not required for a COVID-19 test. The drive-through site is open to everyone, but only residents of Northampton County will have the cost of testing covered by the County if they do not have health coverage. All testing will be through HNL Lab Medicine unless insurance requires an alternate laboratory. Participants should bring a photo ID and their insurance card, if they have one, with them to the testing site.

Fry's Run Watershed Association Program: Family Fun for Children and Adults

Saturday, September 18, 2021, 10 am to 1 pm, offers healthy outdoor activities for young and old, children and parents alike. Activities begin at Fry's Run County Park, corner of 611S. and Royal Manor Rd., in Williams Township.

Visitors will learn, first-hand, how to evaluate a stream's clarity by examining presence of fish and frogs, birds and trees on the streamside. Engaging in arts and crafts, they can express their impressions about the pollinators and macroinvertebrates they'll see, guided by artists Mary and Don, FRWA members.

At 10 am, visitors will follow Scott Douglas, president of Cook's Creek Watershed Assn., as he shows them an array of macroinvertebrates collected right from the nearby stream. They'll see how these tiny creatures play an important role in water health and thus their own health.

At 11 am. visitors can join a FRWA member at another property where Nate Pritchard, Northampton County watershed specialist, can point to impact of stormwater runoff and erosion.

By 12:30 visitors can put to work what they've been learning to assess stream health and its impact on their lives and environment with the FISH protocol.

Throughout the event FRWA will offer for sale a wide variety of native plants and trees -- e.g., Joe pye weed (a name that delights children), cranberry viburnum, elderberry, blue lobelia, and many others.

The event is free, and everybody is welcome to learn the benefits of their local watersheds.
