### New Ag Small Meat Processor Grant Applications

HARRISBURG - Two new grant programs established as part of the 2019-20 state budget to help grow our Commonwealth's agriculture industry are now accepting applications. The Very Small Meat Processor Grant Program will provide funding up to \$50,000 to meat processing businesses with annual sales of less than \$2.5 million and fewer than 10 employees. The goal of the program is to increase the supply of locally produced meat products for local consumption. The funding is to be used to help small processors meet federal inspection and certification requirements. The Urban Agriculture Infrastructure Grant Program will provide microgrants of up to \$2,500 or collaboration grants of up to \$50,000 for projects to improve agriculture infrastructure in urban areas, the aggregation of product, sharing of resources and support for community development efforts. Both programs are now accepting online applications here. The deadline to apply for the Urban Agriculture Infrastructure Grant Program is Friday, Sept. 6. The deadline to apply for the Very Small Meat Processor Grant Program is Monday, Sept. 30. More information is available at www.agriculture.pa.gov.


