
AG and Youth Grant Program Now Accepting **Applications**

SLATE BELT -The Department of Agriculture is inviting proposals for this year's Ag and Youth Grant Program.

The program provides direct grants of up to \$7,500 and matching grants of up to \$25,000 to support projects, programs and equipment purchases by youth-run organizations, and those with programs that benefit youth or promote development in agriculture, community leadership, vocational training and peer networking.

During interviews and public meetings with Allentown residents and community leaders, major concerns were expressed regarding the lack of public spaces for youth to spend their time, especially after school, on weekends, and over summer.

Specifically, community members highlighted the need for a brick-andmortar youth center.

Existing youth centers are available, but they are located outside of Allentown's Center City area and have a primarily recreational, sports-driven focus. They do not offer the varied programming that residents feel is missing from their community, and are not integrated into the Allentown School District. Additionally, community members noted the lack of arts and music programming, academic support, and vocational training currently available to Allentown youths.

Community Action hopes to provide these crucial opportunities through the proposed Allentown Youth Center. The complex issues and challenges afflicting youth in Allentown can be addressed by providing a brick-and-mortar community space where youth can feel safe, build trust and self-esteem, and realize their skills, talents and abilities.

DCNR Announces Investments in ATV and Snowmobile Recreation, **Fall Grant Round Open**



POCONOS - New grant funding totaling \$1,397,400 has been awarded for all-terrain vehicle and snowmobile facilities and trails in Pennsylvania. There are ten grant recipients.

"Thousands of avid ATV and snowmobile riding enthusiasts recreate in Pennsylvania annually and DCNR supports projects that improve upon and expand these types of motorized recreation opportunities across the Commonwealth," Department of Conservation and Natural Resources Secretary Cindy Adams Dunn said. "The fall grant round opened earlier this month and we encourage municipalities and organizations to apply before the September 29 deadline."

The department can award grants two times each year to municipalities and organizations for development of publicly accessible ATV and snowmobile trails and facilities.

Proposed snowmobile and ATV related projects eligible for these grants include planning, land acquisition, development, rehabilitation, maintenance, maintenance and construction equipment, and educational programs related to snowmobile and ATV trails and facilities
