modified for tactical missions, with enhanced off-road capabilities and air transportability.

The bulldog mascot became associated with Mack Trucks during World War I, when Mack delivered over 6,000 trucks to the American and British militaries. British soldiers dubbed the Mack AC models "Bulldog Macks" for their toughness, and the name stuck.

In recent years, the Macungie plant has become a leader in environmental sustainability within the heavy-truck industry. Since 2009, the facility has reduced energy use and carbon dioxide emissions by around 50%. In 2013, Mack became the first U.S. manufacturer to earn the Superior Energy Performance Platinum Mature Energy Pathway certification.
