Rep. Wild Introduces Bill to Keep Child Care Centers Open

At the end of the month, the Child Care Stabilization Grant funding I helped pass through the American Rescue Plan will expire – leaving child care centers, parents, and kids in the lurch if we don't act soon. Without the key funding, more than 152,000 Pennsylvania kids could lose their child care slots, and more than 70,000 child care centers across the country would be forced to close. Access to affordable, reliable, quality child care is essential economic infrastructure that working families need to be able to earn more and get ahead.
