## Another Great Day For The Lehigh Valley Brought To Us Courtesy Of Governor Shapiro!

Governor Josh Shapiro joined B. Braun leaders to announce that the company, which is a global leader in infusion therapy and pain management, will invest \$20 million to expand and modernize its

medical device manufacturing facility in the Lehigh Valley. The project will create at least 200 new, full-time jobs over the next three years and retain 1,704 existing full-time positions. The Commonwealth is supporting the project with \$1.5 million in state funding.

Governor Shapiro's Commitment to Economic Development is Paying Off!

Since taking office, Governor Shapiro has made Pennsylvania more competitive and business-friendly, securing more than \$25.6 billion in private sector investments and over 12,400 new jobs - the most ever in a Governor's first term. The investment means that B. Braun will be looking to hire more workers such as Tessa MacLean, who is an apprentice with the goal of being a process engineer. B. Braun is part of the Industrial Training and Education Consortium of the Lehigh Valley, a partnership of industry, education, government and community organizations to promote careers in advanced manufacturing.

"The ability to learn all these concepts in class and then to turn around and talk to my mentors about the actual functionality and the reason why we do all these things that we do," Tessa said, "and to also know in the back of my mind that if anything happens to any of my family, they are hooked up to my products that will save their lives. ... This has been so surreal."

What a pleasure it was to have the opportunity to meet Tessa, who is a third-generation industrial worker — her father is also a B. Braun employee and her grandfather worked for Bethlehem Steel, and other apprentices.
