Fighting To Reopen The Government And Protect Essential Services

Recently joined Bobby Gunther Walsh's show to discuss the government shutdown — why it happened, what's at stake, and how my team is continuing to work for the people of the Lehigh Valley and the Poconos.

Plain and simple — I voted to keep the government open and funded. Unfortunately, the left in Washington chose to vote against that funding. As a result, we're in a shutdown that hurts our servicemembers, first responders, small businesses, and families. The effects are already being felt, programs like flood insurance and WIC (food assistance for women, infants, and children) are at risk of running out of funding, and families who depend on these services are being left behind.

We've done the responsible thing in the House by passing a clean, short-term funding bill. Liberals can end this shutdown today by supporting a short-term, clean continuing resolution that restores funding and keeps essential services running. It's time to end the political games and start working together to solve problems.
