

Medicare Open Enrollment Starts Oct. 15

Nazareth - The state Department of Aging is reminding beneficiaries of the Medicare open enrollment period starting Tuesday, Oct. 15, and continuing through Saturday, Dec. 7. During this time, you may make changes to your current Medicare coverage, as well as join, switch or drop Medicare Advantage or Prescription Drug Coverage plans.

Pennsylvania offers a free health insurance counseling program, APPRISE, through the local Area Agency on Aging. APPRISE counselors are specially trained staff and volunteers who can provide objective, easy-to-understand information at no cost to you. They can help you understand Medicare eligibility, enrollment, financial assistance programs and coverage options, among other Medicarerelated topics.

Additionally, I am pleased to announce that Medicare/Medicaid Assistance will be offered at my Slate Belt Office on Tuesdays from 1-3pm beginning Oct. 15 through Dec. 3.

The teachers and elementary students had so much fun their first week taking nature walks, reading about Benjamin Franklin, and creating art projects while learning about Van Gogh.

Grace Alliance Academy is a nondenominational hybrid school inspired by the methods of Charlotte Mason, educating grades K-4th. Their focus is to come along side homeschooling families and partner with them by providing two days of teacher-led, in-school instruction and optional lesson plans for the three days at home. Classes meet on Wednesdays and Thursdays from 9am-3pm. School days consist of shorter, age-appropriate class times with a push for educating the whole child through rich literature, character building, and multiple opportunities for outdoor play and learning.
