

Continuing Operations For Tomorrow: Grand Central Seeks to Rezone for Future Disposal

Grand Central Landfill wants to continue providing an essential service to the region, however in order to do that, the WM facility must first rezone the parcel adjacent to the current operations. With less than four years of permitted operating space remaining on the west side of Pen Argyl Road, Grand Central submitted a request to Plainfield Township to rezone

211-acres so that it can continue operating a solid waste landfill on approximately 81-acres of the land. The property is currently zoned farm and forest and the facility hopes to rezone it to solid waste.

The Township Board of Supervisors will have an opportunity to vote on the request later in the process. If the land is rezoned, Grand Central Landfill will submit a detailed application to the Pennsylvania DEP to permit the expanded landfill. Plainfield Township and other local communities will have an opportunity to participate in the Pennsylvania DEP's consideration of that application as well. If continued operations are approved and permitted, there would be no change in permitted waste types accepted at the facility, the site would accept the same average waste volumes, and the designated truck route to and from the site would remain the same. While no vote has taken place yet, we remain committed to transparency and have included our application on our website (www.grandcentrallandfill.com) as well as other supporting documents.
