
Route 611 Roadwork Update

PEN ARGYL - PennDOT has been coordinating with the National Park Service (NPS) for approval of the submitted Special Use Permit (SPU) to mobilize and scale locations of loose rock throughout the closure of Route 611. PennDOT had an in-person meeting with NPS on Sept. 28 and an on-location meeting with staff on Oct. 17 to further clarify the previous discussion.

During these meetings, they reviewed and identified new locations for scaling and vegetation that will need to be removed. They have a grasp on what the physical scope entails and have a newly revised list of scaling locations.

PennDOT has received the requested authorization from NPS to mobilize and begin cutting and clearing vegetation to prepare the site for contractors once the



Route 611 was closed last December due to a rockslide. Because the affected section of Route 611 goes through Delaware Water Gap National Recreation Area, the National Park Service needs to sign off on the work and issue a special permit. With required paperwork taking months to move between state and federal agencies, the construction has gone on longer than anticipated.
