Expand Your Pollinator Habitat!

Looking for a way to add more native plants into your garden? Join us and collect seeds from a variety of native flowers and grasses found in the park! Learn about pollinators the plants attract, which are host plants for caterpillars, and what sort of site conditions are needed in order for the plant to flourish. This free program is for women only and is offered in both English and Spanish. Registration is required.
