725 Acre Industrial Development Planned For The Slate Belt

UPPER MT. BETHEL - River Pointe Logistics Center purchased 725 acres of land for \$17 million in Upper Mt. Bethel one mile from Interstate 80 Portland Toll Bridge, the largest U.S. industrial project this year. The property was once owned by Met-Ed and was sold to energy company GenOn who listed the property for sale in the spring.

The site was selected for its easy access to rt. 80 for both Pa. & N.J. According to the township no plans have been submitted so plans could take years to prepare, it's touted as the "last piece of good industrial property in our area."

The Project will be a huge economic boost to the surrounding communities and the lot of tax revenue to the township and Bangor school district.

Both Lehigh Valley Economic Development Corp., and Northampton County see the potential in the project. Northampton County Executive Lamont McClure would like the property become light manufacturing, possibly in food and beverage packaging. But there is challenges of building a wastewater treatment facility. If that isn't deemed feasible it could mean warehouses being built and that's not what the area neither needs or wants.

McClure since being elected has made good on his promise to help bring economic development to the Slate Belt and will surely be on top of this process as it moves along.

River Pointe has been conducting an economic impact study and also examining exactly what infrastructure would be needed at the site. Besides economic development I think Upper Mount Bethel should take this opportunity to bring a public sewer line to the township with aging septic



tanks leaking sewage into well water of their community.

With the presence of semiconductor industry supplier Air Liquide Advanced Materials and Lamtec Corp., a maker of insulation and laminators, in the area could help draw attention of manufactures looking to expand or
