Here's What the Research Revealed



AMERICANS FEEL GOOD ABOUT RECYCLING, AND COMPANY RECYCLING COMMITMENTS HELP GUIDE THEIR PURCHASES — EVEN AS EVERYDAY BARRIERS CAN LIMIT RECYCLING FOLLOW THROUGH.

The report highlights a significant "Say-Do Gap." While 77% of people say they recycle, real-world data shows a different story. The research found that daily life: being busy, tired, or overwhelmed, is often the biggest barrier to consistent action.

But the data also reveals powerful opportunities:

Recycling is a "Feel-Good" Habit: The emotional connection is strong. Americans associate recycling with positive feelings like satisfaction (48%), optimism (32%), and accomplishment (31%).

The Public Values Corporate Leadership: The report found that 63% of Americans are more likely to buy from companies that use recycled content. This shows a clear public appetite for the circular economy we are helping to build.

[There's a Hunger to Learn: Nearly 3 in 4 people are interested in learning more about what happens to their recycling after pick-up, highlighting a major opportunity for broader education.
