Two months ago, I joined a bipartisan majority in the U.S. House of Representatives to pass a clean, nonpartisan bill to keep the government open. That bill continued to receive bipartisan support in the Senate, but some Senate Democrats repeatedly blocked it from receiving the 60 votes required — causing the longest shutdown in our nation's history. This week, the Senate finally acted, and on Wednesday night, the House passed a bipartisan agreement, which has now been signed into law. The government is officially reopened.

Reopening the Government

This shutdown created enormous hardship for families across the Lehigh Valley and the Poconos — from missed paychecks to delayed benefits and major service disruptions. Throughout this period, my team and I worked across the district to support impacted families and organizations. In recent weeks, we have delivered food to TSA agents and air traffic controllers, met with officials at local food banks, helped WIC providers secure urgently needed funding, and visited children and families who lost access to Head Start.

Government shutdowns should never be used as a political tool, and I will continue advocating for responsibility, bipartisanship, and the needs of the people I serve.
