

Northampton County Open Space Initiative to support ecological restoration, trails, and municipal park development and rehabilitation.

The purpose of the grant program is to protect the County's important natural features by assisting municipalities and organizations to acquire, restore, and enhance permanently protected lands, to provide municipal park acquisition, development and rehabilitation project, trials and greenway development and park, recreation and open space planning efforts.

Livable Landscapes Grant Awards include:

Bangor Borough - \$9,659.00 for Memorial Park Playground Improvements Borough of Hellertown - \$42,575.00 for the Dimmick Park Stair Replacement and Swale Greening

Borough of North Catasaugua - \$7,500.00 for a Trail Connectivity Plan Borough of North Catasaugua - \$8,000.00 for the William J. Albert Memorial Park Shade Structures

Borough of Pen Argyl - \$75,000.00 for the Weonna Park Concession Stands' Improvements

Borough of Wind Gap - \$79,303.00 for the Wind Gap Park Trail Project Bushkill Stream Conservancy - \$50,000.00 for the Bushkill Creek Restoration & Habitat Enhancement

Bushkill Township - \$38,635.51 for the Albert Ponds Park Development Lower Nazareth Township - \$150,000.00 for the Newburg community Park Walking Trail and Bathroom

Palmer Township - \$106,570.00 for the Riverview Park Rehabilitation Project Plainfield Township - \$34,797.50 for the Municipal Building Park Pavilion Project

"The grant funding will help our partners implement their goals to enhance their quality of life and recreational opportunities in their communities," stated Sherry Acevedo, Conservation Coordinator. "The projects awarded in community park development, rehabilitation, planning, and ecological restoration will continue to provide an exemplary park, trail, and recreation network throughout the County".
