

Local 4-H Members Earn Recognition at Pennsylvania State 4-H Horse Show

By Sherri L. Williams / Penn State Extension – Monroe County HARRISBURG - Over 700 youth from 55 counties participated in the 60th Annual Pennsylvania State 4-H Horse Show in Harrisburg, PA. The state show is the final competition of the year for 4-H horse members enrolled in performance projects. To be eligible for the show, members must advance through qualifying competitions at county, regional and district levels. The performance division includes showmanship, horsemanship, equitation, pleasure, over fences, driving, western riding, reining, trail and timed events.

Local 4-H members earn state championships and one reserve championship: Kayla Sobers, Saylorsburg 1st place Working Hunter Ponies Kayla also earned a 3 rd place in Equitation Over Fences (ages 14-18) and a 7th place in Hunter Under Saddle Ponies (over 13.2 hands and not over 14.2 hands).

Savanna Beckwith, Pocono Summit 1st place Saddle Seat Equitation (ages 8-13) 2nd place Saddle Seat Pleasure.

All class champions in the show were awarded champion ribbons, pewter plates, and embroidered champion jackets. Reserve champions were awarded a ribbon and gift certificate.

In addition, the following member placed in her class: Jaycie Smith of Effort earned a 6th place in Pole Bending Ponies (14. Hands and under) (ages 8-13).

Congratulations to Mya Olizarowicz, Emily Reaman, Hannah Shafer, and Rachel Sroka for advancing through qualifying competitions to represent Monroe County at the State Horse Show.

Freeman Announces \$50,000 In State Funding **Approved For Easton Community Revitalization Effort**
