

WM Supports Outdoor Education for Pennsylvania Students

SLATE BELT - WM representatives recently presented a \$4,000 Educational Improvement Tax Credit (EITC) contribution to Hawk Mountain Sanctuary to support guided field trips for public school students across Pennsylvania.

Through this partnership, students gain hands-on exposure to the Appalachian Mountain ecosystem, learn about the importance of birds of prey and conservation, meet a live non-releasable raptor, and experience the outdoors firsthand during a guided hike with Hawk Mountain educators.

"We are thrilled to have WM as a conservation partner who supports and advocates for high-quality outdoor education," said Hawk Mountain President Sean Grace. "All conservation starts with education, and many young people trace their lifelong connection to nature back to experiences like these."

Grand Central's Community and Municipal Relations Manager, Adrienne Fors shared that environmental education is a core part of Grand Central Landfill's mission. "Our long-standing focus on American Kestrel populations, through banding, research and data sharing, reflects our commitment to protecting wildlife while inspiring future conservation leaders. The work closely parallels the exceptional efforts of Hawk Mountain Sanctuary, whose American Kestrel program has advanced the understanding of breeding, wintering, and migratory patterns for more than 50 years."

Since 2007, WM's Grand Central Landfill has proudly partnered with federal bird banders such as Paul Karner and Jere Schade. Today, the program is led by WM's Kevin Kelly.

"Our recent donation to Hawk Mountain Sanctuary is both sentimental

Steel Hearts: The John Henry Musical

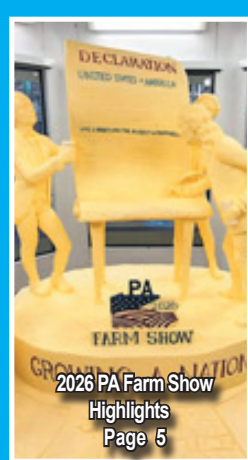
