WHO

NEPA MPO IS LEADING THE STUDY

The Northeastern Pennsylvania Alliance (NEPA) Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) serves as the decision-making body for transportation projects and programs that use federal funding in Carbon, Monroe, Pike, and Schuylkill counties.

WHAT

PA 611 CORRIDOR STUDY

The NEPA MPO is developing a corridor study to examine the effectiveness of current traffic operations and transportation improvements that would be needed for a corridor to be fully functioning in the future. The study will identify problem areas for congestion and safety hazards and develop strategies to improve operations, safety, and access management.

WHY

ACCOMMODATE GROWTH AND DEVELOPMENT

Existing infrastructure is struggling to keep up with the surges in tourism and population throughout the region. An increase in accidents in the area highlights the need for intervention. With several more commercial and residential development projects on the horizon, traffic congestion and safety hazards are expected to increase without proper mitigation. The corridor study will proactively address current challenges, plan for future growth, and ensure safety and efficiency of our transportation network.
