## Troop 34 – Lead By Example

PEN ARGYL - Troop 34 Community Eagle Scout Project Andrew Kondisko from Troop 34 Pen Argyl, PA recently completed his Eagle Scout Project at the Plainfield Township Recreation Trail. The trail which begins in Stockertown and ends in West Pen Argyl, extends over 7 miles, and provides an amazing place for walking, running, hiking, and biking.

Through the dedicated leadership of assistant scoutmasters, Wes Shoup, Brad Scherer, and Bubba Beers, and the support of the Plainfield Township, Andrew created a mile marker improvement project for the trail.

The project included the installation of 26 mile markers and three trail head signs. The mile markers are every quarter mile and the trail head signs were installed at Stockertown, 191/Eddleman's, and Knitter's Hill. Andrew fundraised and collected donations through a virtual 5k on the trail in the Fall of 2020.

Between the virtual 5k and other troop fundraisers, he fundraised more than \$1,700 to purchase materials for the project. This past November, he completed the installation with the help of his family, Wes Shoup, Bubba Beers, and scouts of Troop 34.

Community members shared positive comments with Andrew as he installed the markers. They were so grateful for his leadership and community project. One community member said, "This is a fantastic project and something this trail really needed." Plainfield Township has offered a lot to
