^ **Research has documented** the effects of distribution centers on communities like our own. Effects include unexpected economic repercussions, including effects on roadways and other infrastructure, increased traffic, air pollution, noise pollution, and serious health effects from distribution centers developed too close to residential areas. *Think about 1-6 trucks per minute per million square feet of warehousing.* **These are the statistics.**

^ A study completed by the Economic Policy Institute, reports that Amazon fulfillment centers don't create a boost in local economy as promised. The findings indicate that fulfillment centers opened over the last 15 years **are not** generating broader economic growth.

^ Health and community impact of Warehousing & Logistics are a threat to public health!! Environmental advocates are following growth in the logistics industry with great concern: These giant warehouses are a sprawling and ugly land use that overwhelms the scale of adjacent residential and commercial neighborhoods. **The property value of your home will be negatively impacted!!** Farmland will be converted to immense, windowless warehouses surrounded by asphalt and chain link fencing—is that what we are looking for, in UMBT?
