



#### **Digital Documentation** of Pa. Slate Lands

BANGOR - The Slate Belt Heritage Center will be accepting a massive digital documentation of the Pennsylvania's Slate Lands form the University of Pennsylvania on Sunday March 10th at 2:00 PM. Presenting will be Mr. Frank Matero, Professor of Architecture and Historic Preservation School of Design/University of Pennsylvania with 30 years of experience in teaching architectural conservation. He will be assisted by the teacher/ photographer of the project, Mr. Joseph Elliot who also has 30 years of experience and whose focus is exclusively on historic and industrial sites. Also, Mr. John Hinchman; Project Specialist for the Center for Architectural Conservation who developed the content and format for the website.

The Pennsylvania Slate Belt is an area of 22 square miles. The first guarries opened in the 1830's, but significant growth followed in the first decade of the 20th century when the Lehigh Valley accounted for 1/2 of the slate produced in the United States and eventually the world. Today only a handful remain active. These guarries altered the landscape with deep quarries, spoil heaps, buildings and machinery. Many of these sites are "brownfields" which makes them important for remediation. Preservation and re-use is the impetus for this project.

The Project was divided into three phases:

Survey and inventory of ex-1) tant quarries, structures and other landscape features that made up this regional industry.

Recording & analysis of the 2) most significant of these sites and landscapes.

3) Recommendations for preservation strategies in conjunction with an advanced project team based on data collected during summer and fall of 2015-2017. A website combining geology,

3D quarry models, photos of workers and machinery, illustrations and economic, social and cultural impacts will be shown. The entire website will be turned over to the Heritage Center to be used as a resource in the Slate Belt.
