



Occasionally a potential customer will ask if I can install a specific brand of equipment for them. The answer is yes but that's not the whole answer. I can but maybe I won't. We have a lot of choices of equipment to pick from and there are more opinions on the internet than you can shake a stick at, so why wouldn't I want to install something that is requested by a customer? There are many reasons but I usually start by asking why they wouldn't want to use the equipment that I suggest as the best value for the money. They may say they never heard of it or there are no ads on the weather channel for it or they may just say that their friend has the other brand and they are happy with it. All of those may be valid reasons in their mind but my recommendation goes far beyond the hype and advertisements. Maybe I have toured the factory where it is built and I have used it for 10 years and still say it is the best value. Overall performance and warranty support are huge when it comes to systems that have been in operation for 5 or more years. I hope to see every system I install performing at top efficiency for 20 years. That is not too much to ask but it requires the whole package to be installed correctly and maintained periodically. I have some systems that are over 30 years old and still are running efficiently. Keep in mind that a 30 year old system could never perform up todays efficiency standards but until it breaks down, there is no reason to

replace it. I try to offer more than one choice and sometimes I have more than one brand of mini-split heat pump to will suggest because of research I have done or training I have received. After installing a few of a new brand we had a problem and I found that the warranty support was not adequate. I had to fight to get a part that failed and then we had to remove it from a complete unit just so my customer didn't have to wait a month for that part. Needless to say that brand is now off my list of offerings. I will support the customers who have it and maintain the units we have in the field but they soured me on their support so I won't install any more of them. That is information you won't find on the internet.
