#### CACLV Offering Home Accessibliity, Repair Grants And Loans By Mike Handzo

SLATEBELT - Are you a low-income Slate Belt homeowner with a permanent physical disability? If so, the nonprofit Community Action Committee of the Lehigh Valley (CACLV) is pleased to offer a home accessibility grant and loan program that may help you make needed improvements to your home.

Eligible homeowners will receive a grant to complete accessibility improvements to their home. Examples may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Construction of ramps.
- Widening of doorways
- Installation of stairlifts.
- Accessible bathroom remodels.

These grant funds will be coupled with a deferred payment, partially forgivable loan to complete general health, safety, and code compliance repairs. Examples may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Removal of lead-based paint hazards.
- Electrical, plumbing, or heating repairs.
- Roof repairs or replacements.
- Wall, ceiling, and flooring repairs.
- Minor framing or structural repairs.
- Some "handy work" type items.

The program's goal is to provide eligible homeowners with healthy and safe residences tailored to their accessibility needs, permitting them to hopefully remain in their home for years to come.

The CACLV program will provide participating homeowners with the services of a home accessibility consultant and construction manager, who will work closely with owners to determine the repairs needed to their homes. The program will also provide and manage licensed and insured general contractors to complete the work.

Participating homeowners must own their home; have a permanent physical disability; meet income requirements; have homeowners' insurance; be current on all property taxes; and have enough equity in their homes to support the general repair loan. Program staff will work closely with homeowners to determine their eligibility. Priority will be given to cases where the homeowner needs accessibility improvements to remain in their home, rather than moving to a nursing or care facility.

A designated amount of funding for the program is currently available, and is anticipated to move quickly. Therefore, interested homeowners are encouraged to contact CACLV promptly. # **Easton To Receive Community Revitalization Grant**

EASTON, Feb. 25 – State Rep. Robert Freeman, D-Northampton, today announced the city of Easton has received a \$25,000 grant through the Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development's Keystone Communities program.

As one of 43 recipients, Easton will utilize the funding to develop a comprehensive and citywide economic development strategy to continue building on current successful initiatives and to assist in attracting new investments, increasing the tax base and lowering the overall crime rate.

"I am happy to see that Easton received this critical funding and to be able to continue building a stronger community," Freeman said. "Strong communities and strong economies go hand-inhand, and I am proud to advocate for investments that support both. This grant will help assess what currently works and what more can be done in the future to enhance all aspects of our community."

The Keystone Communities program is designed to support local initiatives that grow and stabilize neighborhoods and communities, encourage the creation of partnerships between the public and private sectors in the community, and enhance the overall quality of life for residents.

Since January 2015, the Wolf administration approved more than \$22 million through the program to fund 131 projects statewide, including façade grants for businesses, accessible housing projects, public infrastructure improvements, and other projects to strengthen communities and downtown districts.
