Spring is on its way. The air is warming and many of the plants are beginning to awaken from their winter slumber. Already you can visit Minsi Lake County Park and see several of the willow species beginning to "plume out." This is especially true for the pussy willow that sends out little buds of fuzz along their slender reddish branches. But there is another plant that is coming into bloom right now this is frequently overlooked if not avoided completely.

Symplocarpus foetidus or "skunk cabbage" is common to shaded wetlands here in north-

eastern Pennsylvania and can be found along the trails and creek banks at Minsi Lake. Skunk cabbage can come into bloom as early as February to as late as May and does so well before the large green leaves appear. The flowers of skunk cabbage do not resemble typical flowers. They are composed of a spathe and spadix - or rather a hood that covers a central rod that is composed of clusters of flowers. If you are interested in seeing one up close, park at the eastern parking lot and hike back to the first bridge. Look for maroon mottled spathes on the right hand side of the bridge on the bank of the creek. There is a small colony there that is

reaching mature bloom. While this plant is not attractive to gardeners, it plays an important part in our ecosystem. Since it blooms much earlier than other wildflowers, it is known as an "ephemeral" plant. All ephemerals provide an important source of food for pollinators that are coming out of hibernation in the beginning of spring. Without these early plants like skunk cabbage, many of the insects we rely on to pollinate our crops would starve. The skunk cabbage is unique from most other ephemerals in that it exhibits thermogenesis - it can chemically create its own heat! It is due to this process that skunk cabbage will come to bloom through snow, well before its ephemeral counterparts. But not all is sweet and warm with this hardy plant.

Skunk cabbage gets its well-deserved name from the smell of its leaves when crushed. Additionally, if the "skunk" part of its

> name isn't enough to scare you off from eating this cabbage, then be warned. This plant contains calcium oxalate crystals, which cause burning and swelling of the mouth, tongue, and esophagus as well as other harmful effects. While you may be able to find some articles that say skunk cabbage was used as a home remedy, it is better to steer a wide path around it, as reactions to the plant can be severe. All of these quirks

though make the skunk cabbage a

wonderful and unique plant to photo-

graph and admire in our wetlands.
